**The September 11th, 2017 minutes were reviewed. Motion by Ron Franks to
approve the September 11th minutes with corrections, seconded by Sam
Halliburton. Motion carried.**

Old Business:

1. Tee Shirt Order – Joyce Sarno brought in samples of the tee shirts on Sunday,
Oct. 8th. What Board members were present at the time approved the minor color
change that needed to be made. Joyce stated that the order will be done in a week.
The total for both orders comes to \$958.00 (tee shirt, hat, and orange shirts for the
judges and safety officers)

Kitchen Report:

Mandy distributed the itemized report for the kitchen. She stated that last Sunday Oct. 8th was packed, the kitchen brought in \$400.00. Amy stated that she still needs workers in the kitchen, most people she calls do not answer or work on Sunday.

Trap

Archery

Facilities:
